**Erasmus+ KA131 mobility co-financing options**

Once a student is selected for mobility under this call, the Erasmus+ financial support is NOT automatically assigned. Students will be informed by e-mail about all further procedures, the amount of Erasmus+ grants awarded, the possibility of obtaining additional scholarships and [Online Language Support - OLS](#). The possibilities for co-financing the Erasmus+ KA131 mobility for the 2024 project year are as follows:

	For distances of less than 500 km, participants generally travel by low-emission means of transport.
- Calculation of travel support	To calculate support for travel costs, UP will use the European Commission's tool - <a href="#">the distance calculator</a> , where the distance is calculated from UP to the host institution of the student's mobility. Example: the mobility takes place at the Universidad Juan Carlos, Madrid, Spain, main transport used is plane (ordinary travel): Distance UP (Koper, SI) - Universidad Juan Carlos (Madrid, ES) = 1524.26 km = 309 € support for travel costs
	Participants eligible for travel support may, in exceptional cases, also receive exceptional travel costs. Financial support for high travel costs of participants may be granted if these costs are well justified. The following conditions must be met in order to obtain funding: - the participant may apply for 80% of the total eligible costs, - the normal funding rule (based on unit costs for the distance range) does not cover at least 70% of the participants' travel costs If a grant is awarded to cover exceptional travel costs, these shall replace the travel support.
- Green travel	<i>*Green travel is defined as a travel that uses low-emission means of transport, such as bus, train or car sharing, for the majority of the travel.</i>  <i>Documentation of green travel: a declaration of honor signed by the student and the sending organization. Where appropriate, students should submit relevant documentation about the incurred costs (tickets, invoices).</i>
- Co-financing of travel days to/from mobility	In case of ordinary travel, one day of travel before the mobility and one day of travel after it can be co-financed (using the respective daily amount, that is used for long-term** or short-term*** mobility).  In case of a green travel, in addition to the Erasmus+ support for travel costs, an Erasmus+ daily amount applicable to long-term** or short-term*** physical mobility may be awarded for the return journey for a maximum of six travel days.  **that is 1/30 of the monthly amount *** daily amount valid for short-term mobility
- Additional	In addition to basic Erasmus+ grants, students with fewer opportunities will be able to receive additional support. The conditions for

- Additional funding for students with special needs <sup>1</sup>	Following UP's call for Erasmus+ EU grants students with the status of a person with special needs will be able to apply for additional funding for students with special needs, if, their eligible budget set for the nature of their specific needs exceeds additional support for inclusion.		

In previous years, the University of Primorska has also been granted additional funds from the Public Scholarship, Development, Disability and Maintenance Fund of the Republic of Slovenia for students participating in Erasmus+ mobility abroad. According to the call for proposals "Ad futura - Erasmus+ 2024 (358. JR)", there is a possibility that students who meet the conditions set out in the relevant call for proposals from the Public Scholarship, Development, Disability and Maintenance Fund of the Republic of Slovenia will be able to obtain additional funds in addition to the Erasmus+ EU grant, for the project year 2024 this is 33.97€ /month.

The implementation of the Erasmus+ program at UP is linked to the project activities of various active projects, which, depending on the approved available funds, enable co-financing of students selected to participate in mobility within the Erasmus + KA131 project. As a rule, the available contractual funds of

<sup>1</sup> Persons with special needs include individuals who need to implement programs with additional professional assistance or with adjustments according to the nature of the specific special need. Students with special needs are: blind or partially sighted students or students with visual impairment, deaf and hard of hearing students, students with speech and language disorders, physically challenged students, long-term ill students, students with autistic disorders and students with emotional and behavioral disorders. the relevant projects that end first are used first. The University of Primorska, as the contractor of this tender, reserves the right to change or supplement the conditions of co-financing. In the event of changes, all selected candidates will be duly informed. Students are expected to be informed in more detail about the possibility of co-financing mobility by June 2025.

It is important to be aware that Erasmus+ co-finances the costs of studying abroad and does not cover the costs in full. The amount of the awarded funds will be defined in the Erasmus+ Grant Agreement, which will be signed by the student with UP after the submission of the application documentation. A student receiving an Erasmus+ EU grant continues to be eligible for other regional, national or other grants not managed by a national agency but by another organization (eg ministry or regional authorities).
